The Society for the Furtherance of British Columbia Indian Arts and Crafts was formed to promote interest in traditional native arts and to assist in marketing it. In 1951, the society incorporated and changed its name to the British Columbia Indian Arts and Welfare Society.

The records include correspondence, clippings, scrapbook and printed matter and an account of the history of the Society, 1923-1945, by Alice Ravenhill, Honorary Secretary.
