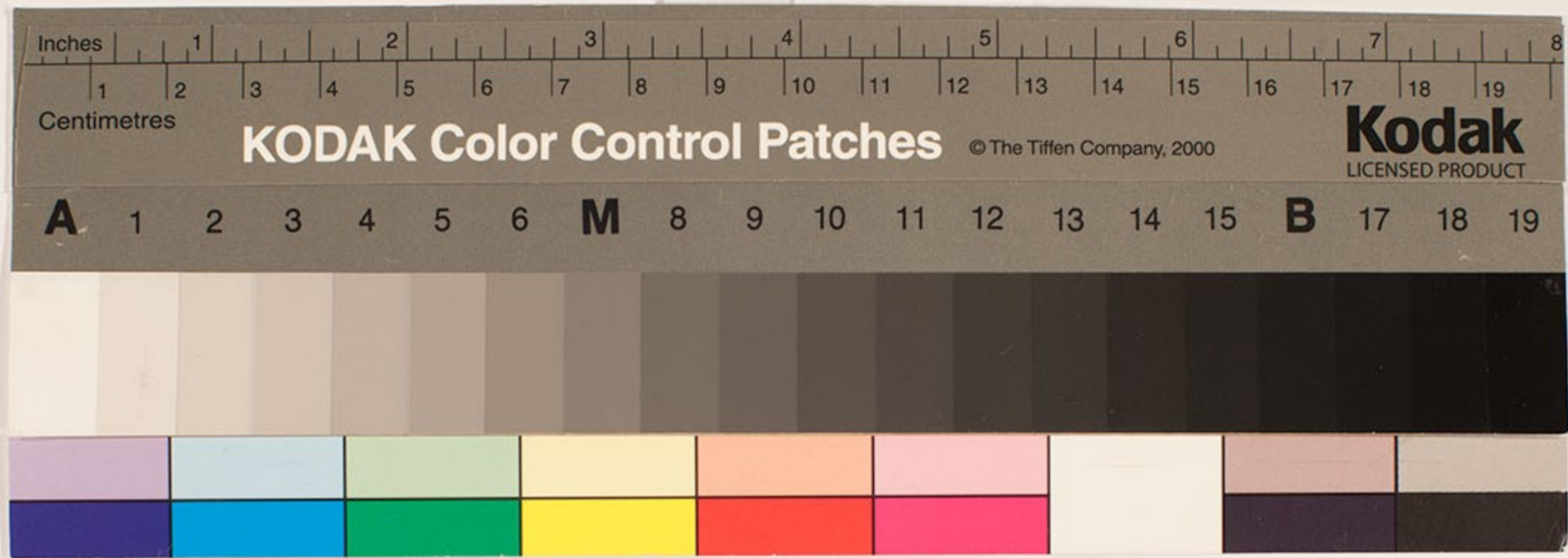

British Columbia & to wit. 1. The Jurors for our Lady the Queen upon their oath present that Ah Yue on the twenty-third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three ~~the shop of Benjamin Williams situate in Johnson Street in the City of Victoria and Province of British Columbia feloniously did break and enter and eighteen yards of cloth of the goods and chattels of the said Benjamin Williams in the said shop feloniously did steal take and carry away, against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided and against the peace of our Lady the Queen her Crown and dignity.~~

2. And the Jurors aforesaid upon their oath aforesaid do further present that Ah Yue on the twenty-third day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three eighteen yards of cloth of the goods and chattels of Benjamin Williams before then feloniously stolen taken and carried away feloniously did receive and have, he the said Ah Yue then well knowing the said goods and chattels to have been feloniously stolen taken and carried away against the form of the Statute in such case made and provided and against the peace of our Lady the Queen her Crown and dignity.
