There has hitherto been no regular
allowance of provisions to the Gracer River
St. Ship. supplies having been furnished
from time to time on requisition from the
master in charge.

As the number of persons to be rationed
on board the St. Ship is the same - viz four -
as at Race Rock St. House - and as it
would be more convenient - and at the
same time ~~less~~ expensive - that the
system on which supplies are now fur-
nished to the latter establishment should
be extended to the former - I have
asked for tenders for provisioning the
St. Ship on the same scale - with some
slight additions & alterations - as now supplied
to Race Rock St. House -

Jell & Finlayson offer to supply these
provisions at the rate of \$65⁰⁰ per month
Mr Harris asks \$83³³ per month -

I beg therefore that I may be
authorized to contract with the former
firm for the delivery of these supplies
on board the St. Ship at the monthly rate

The 13th May 1870

I beg to inform you that
Messrs. Fell & Co., supplied a
boat upon the 29 day of April
and 36 Primals of Meat which
is not more than 4 days supply
of Meat and this day is the first
communication which has been
from Messrs. Fell & Co. since the
29 day of April. And as there has
been no communication we have
been out of Meat at the Light
House for 6 days this is the second
time during one month that we
have been out of Meat at the
Light House we the undersigned

Light Keepers therefor shall the
liberty of inquiring whether
it could not be arranged to
supply a supply of meat to remain
at the Light House on such occasions
as when we run short as we can
not depend upon the meat boat
coming for 8 or 9 days after do at the
Light House. If it could be arranged
so as not to keep the undermentioned
Light Keepers without meat for
5 or 6 days it would confer a great
favor upon the undermentioned
