 had been 3 mos - on July 2<sup>nd</sup> went to

Saw big crowd - angry at Scabbs -

 much noise - 10 times as many

 Heard around when going back to work -

 when I saw accused but before we  
 went off shift - Saw nothing unusual -  
 did not sit in seat - stood up at  
 back of seat - Saw other constables -  
 did not see Sturges. Young or Westbank  
 Lt. of Union was in that crowd -  
 Jordan Secy of Local Union - for some  
 years - did not hear Chief men  
 order crowd to disperse -  
 A group in vicinity of crowd seen  
 talking about the constables being hired -  
 Campbell was heard when he went

At about P.M. Aug 11 - saw  
 accused - knew Campbell or - heard

 did not see Rocks - know how far
