S Y N O P S I S:

JOHN CARTWRIGHT:

P.7. James R. Roaf. Was in crowd by Louis Nuenthal, a.m. of 13th. Wanted these men. Kemp and special Police. Demand. Had to have them. Sufficient to carry out their demands if I had refused.

P.11. Foy. Angry crowd half mad. Sticks and clubs.

P.57. Arbuthnot. Did not see him.

P.73. Richardson. P.74. Was next to big Louis.

Would burn me up.

P.80. Ludbrook. Don't know him at all.

JOHN COPELAND:

P.7. Was in mob-the same as Cartwright.

P.15. Tonkin. Made threats to pull me from the steps of the office. Clubs. With Louis and Robinson.

P.17. The three active men.

P.51. McGregor. With O'Connell and Robinson. In crowd of 200 beating up workmen. Said they would give me 24 hours to quit. Would like to get hold of me for twenty minutes.

P.54. Arbuthnot. Ordered me not to go to work. It would be worse off for me if I did. I was not to go back again.

P.56. Had a big stick in his hand. Told me to quit work.

P.60. Alexander. In crowd at Depot. To save our lives. Clubs. One man down 45 times.

P.68 Proctor. Was stopped by several miners. 11 a.m. 13th. Very hostile. Clubs. Court Martial. Interfering with picketing. Was close to me.

P.79. Ludbrook. We were driven out by strikers up to the Depot. They put us on the train.

Ps.68 and 69. Procter. Threatened me with big sticks. Crowd very hostile. Court ~~Marshak~~. Martial.

P.78. Ludbrook. In crowd of 500 broke my windows dragged me out of the house. Got four cuts on my head, bruises on the back and shoulders. They took me outside. They used their sticks. I was unconscious.

Taken away someplace a prisoner. Taken within half a mile of Nanaimo, and left there, and told not to come back. The place was destroyed. The property in the bunk house was destroyed.

Ps.68,69 and 70. Proctor. Was stopped by mob. Clubs. Court Martial. Louis ^{striking} stopped Columbia from/me.

Ps.71,72,73 and 74. Ben Richardson. Louis came to my house. Louis came to my house with mob. If you have got any men in your house we will burn your house up and your barn and everything. I stopped them at the door. They had clubs and rocks, struck the side of the house. Louis was spokesman. Big Louis was first.

Ps.75 and 76. Crunk. Big riot. They smashed my house up, - half past eight or nine p.m. of 12th. Saw Louis at the office next morning. Clubs and sticks. Louis had a stick waving it in the air.

P.79. Ludbrook. Was with crowd when I got assaulted and when we were driven out.

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HENRY O'CONNELL:

P.7, Roaf. Was with crowd that demanded surrender of men, along with Cartwright.

P.18. Tomlin. Was not there.

Ps.20 and 21. McCrory. In crowd that smashed bunk house. Also next morning. Some had sticks.

P.24. Ward. Saw him at the station. I was assaulted.

Ps.27 and 28. Hollingsworth. Saw him at the station. Bathing Kemp's head.

P.30. Kemp. Saw him in the mob at the bunk house. 10 a.m. next morning. Mob led by Louis. I had to come out. Was struck in the face by O'Connell and several others. Had a cut on the head, several blows on the body, one of which cracked my ribs. Medical treatment. I was warned I had better keep off the Island. Revenge on account of charge for trespass.
