

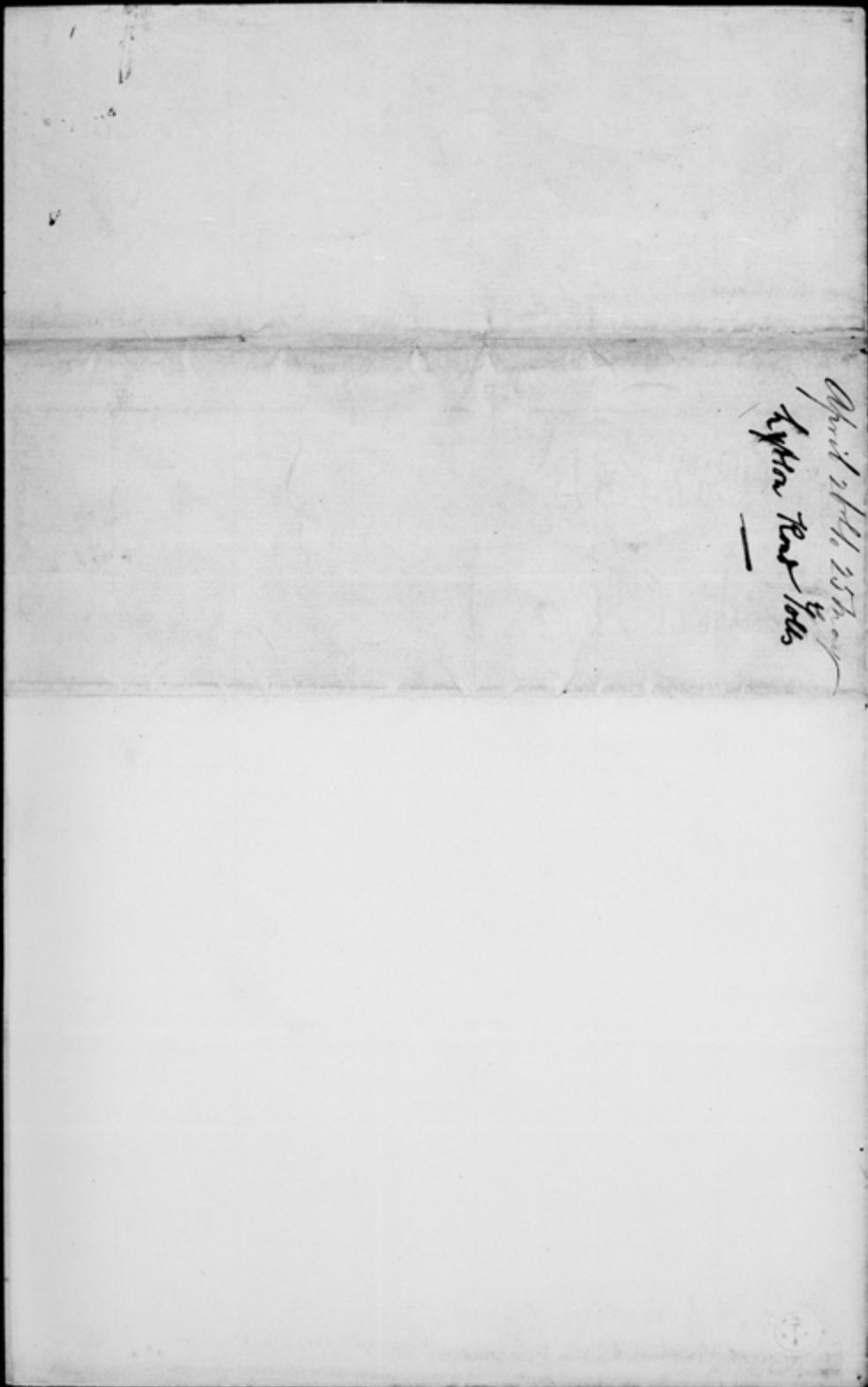

I have the honor to inform you that on the 24th inst. the Toll Collectors Office and dwelling house at this place were totally destroyed by fire,

The origin of the fire cannot be clearly ascertained but is supposed to have been caused by a spark having escaped from the stove pipe and set fire to the lining of the kitchen in which room the fire originated. On account of the severity of the weather I had been obliged to live entirely in the kitchen for several days and on the evening of the 24th I left the house about 6^h 30^m when there were only a few embers smouldering in the stove which I closed entirely before leaving, at (about

I have the Honor to report for the Information of His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government that the Toll Collectors Office and dwelling House at this place were totally destroyed by fire on the 24th ultimo. I have had not been any fire in either the Office or large room adjoining it for several days as I had been obliged to sit in the kitchen on account of the extreme coldness of the weather.
