Deposition I live at Rytton I was on the mountain about the first week in November with Que, Han, Sun and Shin, Che, Can, they quarrelled about a Deer, Que, Han, Sun, took a stick and struck Shin, Che, Can, he held up his gun to avoid the blow, ~~they then~~ they then struggled together for the gun I saw blood upon Shin, Che, Can, hands, and a knife in Que, Han, Sun, hand. I did not see prisoner but Shin, Che, Can, with the knife as I had my arms around his body pulling him away from Shin, Che, Can.

Deposition of Proseutor

My name is Shin Che Kan, I live
at Mission I went from Gytton on
the Mountain with my wife, and
met the prisoner, Sue Han, Can,
and staid with him 3 or 4 weeks
hunting, we had a dispute about a
deer, Sue Han, Can, struck me with
a stick and took me by the shirt
collar, I told him to let me go
but he would not desist. He then
got my knife out of my belt
and stab me twice, cutting my
wrist, he also struck me twice
with his gun, I believe he would
have killed me if I had no
assistance
