It is not the intention of the Department to be unduly severe with those holders of pre-emption records who are honestly trying to comply with the requirements of the "Land Act", and as there is no record to show that you had applied for, or received "Leave-of-absence", as provided in Sec. 23 of said "Act", you can hardly blame the Department for asking for an explanation.

If it is your desire to continue to hold this land, I would suggest that you immediately comply with the occupation requirements of the "Act", and in future taking care that "Leave-of-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 11th instant in which you state you fail to see on what grounds the statement is made that you have not been occupying your pre-emption as provided in the Land Act.

I would point out to you that you are not occupying this land as required in the said Act, which in Section No. 21, reads:- "The occupying in this Act required of a pre-emptor means a continuous beneficial personal residence of the pre-emptor, or of his family, on the land recorded by him." Section 22 reads:- "Every pre-emptor, as well as his family (if any), shall be entitled to be absent from the land recorded by such pre-emptor for any one period not exceeding two months during any one year....."

This latter section does not mean that you may be absent almost continually throughout the year, as appears to have been the case in this instance, but may be absent for one period not exceeding two months in each year. From the report of the Inspector of Pre-emptions in this Office it would appear that your usual place of abode is Poplar, not on your pre-emption.

Replying to your inquiry of the 9th November, instant, as to the necessity and advisability of continuing the grant paid to the Resident Physicians at Nakusp and Edgewood, I beg to state that I consider the grant for Nakusp very necessary at the present time, as the number of residents in that vicinity is not great enough to fairly support a medical practitioner, and the number, during the past year is rather reduced than otherwise.

In regard to Edgewood, there does not seem to be the same necessity for assistance, as the district is much more settled and with a more prosperous class of settlers. Moreover, I have been given to understand that the Physician now practicing there has other means which place him in a more favorable position than the one at Nakusp. From the information gained, I cannot recommend a grant for Edgewood for next year.

In a general way there is hardly a living for a medical practitioner anywhere in the Revelstoke District outside of the City of Revelstoke, and the population is so scattered that, except at Nakusp and Edgewood, there is no point at which one could be placed who would be able to serve any large number of residents, at least until the lumbering industry recommences.
