CLAIM OF HOOEY TOY.

1. The Claimant's name is HOOEY TOY, and his address for service and other purposes herein is No. 311-312, Sayward Building, Victoria, B.C., Canada.
2. The Claimant's claim is for the destruction and theft of his property and effects at South Wellington when he was driven out of his place of abode by strikers in August, 1913; in respect of which said loss the Claimant claims the sum of \$1,030.50, full particulars whereof are contained in a Notarial declaration made by the said Claimant before me on the 11th day of August, 1916, and hereto annexed.
3. And the Claimant further claims in respect of his said loss; and for trespass; for assault on him; and for loss of employment, such damages as the Commissioner may see fit to allow.

TO WIT:

I, HOOEY TOY, of No. 523, Johnson Street, in the City of
Victoria, British Columbia; formerly of South Wellington in the said
Province, shoe maker and repairer, do solemnly declare:

1. That in the year 1913, I owned a house in South
Wellington, in which I lived; and I had in that house a stock
of leather; and shoes; tools for repairing shoes; and some
grocery provisions.

2. I had lived in the house for two years prior to 1913.

In the second week in August, 1913, a number of white
men strikers came to South Wellington. They carried guns,
sticks and hammers, and were shouting and driving the Chinese out
from their houses.

3. At this disturbance, I was much frightened and ran
away, hiding in the woods all night. Next morning, as soon as
there was light enough, I went on to Ladysmith, hiding in the
bush by the wayside if I saw anyone.

I stayed at Ladysmith two or three days and then came
on to Victoria.
