This Deponent Isidore Braverman
upon his oath saith as follows.

Yesterday afternoon about 2 o'clock
the prisoner entered my office and
asked me if I had any washing
to do, I did not answer him,
because I stopped outside to help
a Lady into her horse which took
me about 2 minutes - When I
returned the Chinaman was
inside and he did not face
me, and he held his hands in
such a way as to arouse my
suspicion, and I found he had
on his person a Box of cigars, which
were mine and which is the
same Box now produced,
I picked up the Box which he let
fall he ran away. I arrested him
and gave him into the custody of
the Police
