

Tibbet and Jimmy are
both here Jimmy started to
work on last Wednesday
morning and got hurt by the
roof falling on him he is
willing to stay here until the
Priest comes along but as
Bozil is determined to go he

is going I with them Bazil
made up his mind to go the
day after he got here Felice told
me then that if Bazil went
he would go I do not know
any other reason ^{but} that they are
homesick I am not giving them
anything to go with Felice worked
4 days and Bazil 3½
Tibbet will be stopping here
for a while and will help
me working if he is able till
I can get more help he is now
troubled with some eyes and
would like to get some medicine
from M^r. M^cKenzie if you
would kindly send it
I will try to do all I can
towards moving the buildings If
those White men winter in

in here again there will be no difficulty about getting the work done but we cannot depend on them therefore I think it would be advisable if you can get 3 or 4 good men to come up with the scow that will stay and work it it would be the best way to get over the hetch I will know by the 10th of next month if those men will be staying in here or not and will probably be able to let you know by the Preist when he goes out

There has been no Indians around since I came except Flanagan and Charlie Hunter


who was here and had gone into
the store the morning I got here
I got the account of all they
took and Charlie paid me for
the goods he took they said
they were starving and had no
ammunition and could not
wait any longer they took
ammunition and Dry meat
the meat they have promised
to return

Dear Sir:

As Father Morrice leaves here tomorrow for Stuarts Lake I take the opportunity to write you a few lines to let you know how I am getting along.

I am glad to say that I have managed to move the stone down and have the logs up and the rafters for the roof made and put up today. The balance of the work I will be able to do by the time the scow gets here if I keep my health. I have Tibbet Charlie Hunter and Flaman working and the Priest's men helped me while they were here.

I would like to get some boards sawn for shelving and the logs for the house taken out by the scow-men. and think that I can get ~~it~~ the work all done a little under the estimate that is if I keep all right. I have only seen two of the Indians besides C Hunter and Flaman since I came. and therefore made no trade to speak of yet. my turnips is coming on very slow I do not think they will amount to much. I have not heard anything from the prospecting party as yet.

They may be down next week if they intend
to winter in here again
I think that is about all I have to say this
time so I will close hoping this will find
you and Mr Murray in the enjoyment of
of good health as I am happy to say it
leaves me at present


P.S. I have given Packat 6 M^s



The ~~other~~ party of prospectors
that wintered here has got
back they got here last Sunday
and will be going out as they
did ^{not} make enough to keep
them for another year without
going out. They made \$700⁰⁰
on the bars. They found one
bar where they made \$500⁰⁰
in 5 days. They are going to
stay here till the scow
arrives and will be helping
me put up the house. I am
going to make new logs
I think it will be quicker and
cheaper and won't make the
house quite so large. No snow

Dear Sir

The Scow arrived here Sunday 25th with its load in pretty fair condition except 1 keg of Butter which had the top broken off and the brine all emptied out. and some other things a little wet on the outside but I do not think it will amount to anything. The deck of the scow was caulked but not pitched or braced so as to keep the boards from springing. I have not opened any of the goods yet as I have not quite finished the shelves but will have the store all ready in a couple of days.

I am keeping the crew here for 2 days. to pull the house down and bring the logs and Lumber down to the new site I expect they will get every thing down this evening and will be ready to start back tomorrow. I have the store put up and roofed with new shales I also put a new counter in out off the old boards which was over from the roof as I did not put the pitch quite so high. The work I have done with provisions and tools, ^{also advances to Felix and Bazil at S.L. and the L.L.} included, cost 360. M.B. If Felix and Bazil had stuck to their work it would not have

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have

Cost, quite so much. The House I expect will not cost quite so much as I can take my time and do a good deal of the work myself. The stone I pushed and got all the help I could get so as to have it ready for the goods when the scon arrived I will try and keep Sagalau and Atsol till I get the logs and roof up and get a few boards sawn then they can go and I can finish the rest during the fall and winter

I was very glad to gather from your letters that B.L.O came out with so nice a profit. I did not expect quite so much and feel thankful that you are satisfied with my management of B.L.O. except my mes. at which I am not surprised if you charged all the provision made to it with the exception of a little ^{old} given to Vital and some ^{given} in gratuity I think if you look in (the exchange of goods acct in my Book you will find a mount of 37 M.B. worth of meat given besides those other two amounts and also on my inventory I think I put 100. M.B. of meat, which makes 137 M.B. of provisions Trade which should be deducted from my last years mes. acct

I have not made any trade worth speaking about since I came back as no Indians very few Indians has come in I am sending all the furs traded

This is all the trade that I have made up to date but expect I will get some furs this coming month when the other Indians begin to come in. I have not seen Davie since I came back. I hear that he has gone up the river with Kandachiney's band.

The scow takes 16 bales of Fur outfit 94. 1 bale Outfit/95 You already have the packing acc't of .94. Furs. There are 10 bales of Moose skins, Cariboo, Marmot, and Babiche as follows.

There are 2 Moose skins in Bale #17. and 4 in #18 making 160 Moose skins sent out. or $12\frac{1}{2}$ short of what should be I sold those since I came back ^{also} 1 Marmot skin Robe and 8 lbs Babiche belonging to Out/94

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There is also 1 Case containing 28 lbs Castorum
 I am very sorry that I have no meat to send
 you as all I had is about done. I have not been
 able to get any since I came back.

The M. & H. C prospecting party returned here last
 Sunday 2 of them have been working for the last few
 days chopping sleepers for the house and clearing for
 which I have given them orders on Stuarts Lake. for
 $16\frac{1}{2}$ M. B. charged to Repairs and Improvements

I also enclose you a list of Tools and other goods
 which they had over and ~~for~~^{left here} which they have agreed
 to take sell at your valuation. Hill and Cooper
 is going out they will take $\frac{2}{3}$ of the amount
 you pay for the goods and please credit J. Murdock
 with $\frac{1}{3}$. he is going to stay in here this winter
 also a list of stuff belonging to J. V. Cooper
 and A. Hill. which they agree to sell at your
 valuation.

I have also given Hill & Cooper an
 Order on McLeods Lake for 35 skins.
 balance coming to them on provisions
 exchanged. viz FLOUR & Bacon. Tea
 & Candy. a part of which they may get
 an order on Stuarts Lake from Mr. Ware
 Hill & Cooper are on their way out
 to the Coast and would like to go down

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down with you if you are going to Quenelle in a canoe this fall. (I have found the two men straight forward and honest in all their dealings with me.)

I bought them Canoe for 40 M B. which I think was a good bargain as it will come in very usefull here I will get Sagalan and Bazil to saw lumber for a small scow to take out the furs next spring and will build the scow myself with Vital, help I am sending Attol back and keeping Bazil Sagalan in his place as Attol is sick and not able to work Bazil agrees to give him 20. M B. out of his 70 M B. for his trip and will work from today at 45 M B per month.

I also enclose you an order for supplies required by J Murdoch who is staying in here this winter for which he agrees to pay Stuarts Lake Cash prices with the freight added to B.L.O. please have those goods shipped to McLeod by the 10th of September, as I will send a canoe to McLeods Lake by that time if possible I also require a few things which will make up a canoe load and please send us all the papers and any kind of reading matter that you can spare, also the 2 gall of Rum

Hudson's Bay Company.

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Rum that you promised to give me for my own use. Mr. Gresham & Mr. Ware promised to send me some papers and reading masters by the scow but failed to full fill their promise and I am very much disappointed at not getting anything to read this winter and hope that you will be kind enough to send me all you can for which I will be willing to pay all expenses of getting it in and for the price of it at S. Lake I think if I have nothing to read this winter that I will go crazy and please send my mother the sum of twenty dollars about Christmas and charge to my acct I will send you all my accounts by Sagalane when he goes out.

And please tell Jimmy Alexander that I will expect that he will have the canoe brought to Mc Leads Lake that I let him have when he went out last summer or be ready to pay me 20 m B. for it as I paid Victal on my private acct. and that I have something else to tell Jimmy when I meet him (viz opening my letters that I sent to Mr. Ware by him,

as I have not got a place to write in just
now. I think that is all I have to say
just now as I am very busy looking after the



My Dear Mr Murray,

Just a few lines at the
latent the scow is just ready to start
I have the Logs & Lumber off the house
down here, brought by the scow crew
and will start to put up my house tomorrow,
I am keeping Bazil instead of. Otkol as
the latter is no good for me and think
I can get more work out of Bazil
I have given J V Cooper an Order
on Sagalas acct for \$35⁰⁰ Cash, for
a breech loading shot gun you can pay it
and if he quits work before he pays for it
I will keep the gun

I intend to put Sagalas and Bazil
at sawing as soon as we get the logs
and rafters off the house up. Otkol and
J Murdock is going up the river again
tomorrow and wont be back before cold
weather or about the time the river is
freezing up. Murdock will buy some of the
tools left here by the M.H.C party but
says for you not to value them too high

The Ormung wheel on groundstone
will be very useful to me, here

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I sold Agnane the breech loading shot gun, for 40 M.B. which I gave you an order for 25 dollars cash last summer on my private acct, 30 M.B. from Agnane's acct, please credit me with, I got his Martin Carbine for 20 M.B.

Vital got here on Sunday just before the snow he only made \$9⁰⁰ on his way up but will be starting up the river with Murdoch tomorrow to go over the bar that they got \$100.⁰⁰ per day out off, so I think he has a pretty good chance of paying off all of his acct, they will be coming back about the time the river freezes up and will winter here I am sending you an order for supplies for Murdoch he has the money here to pay for it and thinks that he will find rich digging this fall or next summer.

Please send us all the reading matter you can gather up at S.L., any kind of reading, old magazines or papers will do.

I have given Murdoch an Order for 10 skins for 1 set of 45-70 Lee roadway Tools. I also enclose an Order given by


Mr. Fox
Dear Mr. Fox

I am sorry to inform you that I have not been able to get hold of any wood yet which would be good for your purpose. I have however got a few pieces of pine wood which I think will do. I will send them to you by express. I hope you will be able to receive them before long. I will let you know when they arrive.

The wood being so air is very easily blown off windows etc. but the pine wood is not so liable to be blown off. It has however been found to be very good for pine wood for the reason that it has a tendency to become

Dear Sir. I left B.L.C.
last Thursday in my big Canoe
with Bazil and Glaman.

intending to make a fast trip
for the supplies required for
Murdock and also for some
things that I think I will be
short off. I expected to find
John Ware here and get the most
of the provisions out of his stock
if those had not arrived that I
ordered for Murdock.

I have my House pretty well
nearly finished only to put in the

Hudson's Bay Company.

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the door and windows I left Sagalan to finish it and hew logs for lumber for a small boat or Scow which I intended to build myself. and also to chink the seams of the store and house with moss while I was away I told him if I did not get back by the time he was done with that to begin to clear off the wood from around the building ~~and~~
I do not expect any Indians to arrive at the Fort till the river begins to freeze. so I thought I would have plenty of time to make the trip ~~as~~ more on account that I could not trust the men I have to come alone. I Bazil gets

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to S.L.
There, before Mr. Ware leaves
kindly send 3 or 4 pds of Blankets
any size you can spare and some
Soap. Blue mottled and Toilet Soap
also the material to make a cover
for my scow which will be about
30 feet long by 4 feet in width
If Mr. Ware can't spare Flour
enough to make a load send about
500 lbs. for Murdoch I also met two
other White men on the Parsnip
who is intending to go up the Finlay
River next summer. They are working
the bars on the Parsnip and Finlay this
fall and intend to winter somewhere
up there they told me they would
require some Flour and Beans in the
spring and asked me if they could

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get it up there so I think we could do with 250 lbs more or 750 lbs in all I also require a scythe and snath to cut the weeds from around the buildings before I leave next spring summer. but I guess I can get that here. I hope you will kindly send me the 2 gallons of Rum as it is so long to go without a drink. and also the 3 for Murdoch He and Vital started up the river to the bar where they was last summer and will be back to the Fort about the 10th of October

I think that it would not be a bad idea to put an advertisement in one of the Victoria papers asking into

Finlay to apply to the H.B.C. before
leaving to have supplies shipped in
for them

I heard from all the different
bands of Indians at B.L.C. before
I left. a few came in ~~from~~^{for Tea} the
and Tobacco. Davie came in last
week. very humble. I told him I had
a letter for him from you about the
row we had last spring he asked me
to read it which I did he then told
me to thank you for warning him
and says he intends to make a Hunt
this Fall and winter and hopes to pay
a part of his old jahbone he started
off up the river with some of the
far Siccamese he had a couple of
Lge Bear Skins and some Mooseskins
he bought Ammunition and the 44 Cal

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revolver. which came by the scow
but did not ask for jawbone.

The Indians up there have heard ^{from Tommy}
about the raise on Bear and Marten
skins at M^c. Leod's Lake. and want
to know if we cannot give them
16^{or 17} for Lge Bear and 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ for Marten
this winter I told them I would
ask you about. please let me know
~~if I can~~ give them that or not
this winter I think we could get
a pretty good Marten trade if
they got 2 $\frac{1}{2}$. for them but I do
not think it would make much
difference in the Bears. as they kill
all they can for the price we pay
but they sadly require all they
can get. please send me all

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the old reading matter you can
spare. and if I am not in debt
please send for about \$5⁰⁰ worth
of novels ~~and~~ for me. this winter
so that I can get them next summer.

I would like to go in to Stuarts
Lake myself. but I am thoroughly
played out. and will stay here till
Mr. Ware comes out. If he could
spare me the supplies here and
hang out with the Liquor and
reading matter I might get off
a day or so sooner then I would
if I have to wait till the others
comes back. I got here just at
dark tonight Bazil starts early
in the morning on foot he says he
will go in in 2 days I hope he will

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so that I would be glad if he comes back but if he does not I wont be stuck as I think I will be able to get all the rest of the work done without him but I would like to get the lumber for the scow sawn this Fall and there is nobody up there can saw except Vital and perhaps he wont be close to the fort this winter he talks of going up the Ingee neeka to winter I can not think of anything else just now but will write again when Sagalan and Bazil comes out and send you all the L.I.S. accts
