**“Registration of Births, Deaths, and Marriages
Act, 1872.”**

11. Every Medical Practitioner, who shall have been in attendance during the last illness and until the death of any person, shall, within thirty days after the death of such person, transmit to the Registrar of the District in which the said Practitioner resides, a certificate under his signature of the cause of death, according to a form to be provided by the said District Registrar, who shall be furnished with such forms; and it shall be the duty of every such Medical Practitioner to apply to the said District Registrar for blank forms for that purpose. * * * *

19. If any householder, head of a family, Clergyman, Registrar, Physician, or other person or persons required by this Act to report births, marriages, and deaths, refuses or wilfully neglects to do so within the time named, such persons shall, for each and every offence, forfeit and pay a sum not less than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars and costs, in the discretion of the presiding Justice before whom the case shall be heard. * * * *
