I was Chief of Police in charge at the last Assize held here for the County of Vestmanster, when the Jury brought in their vordict in the caso of the queen vs. Go Dop and Chuns Chuey; I was present furang part of the time the accused was


SING LESE, upon h2s oath seith as follows:-
I remember the 23 rd of Fobruary last; about four o'clock in the afternoon of that day I vent into my house and found that mon when contained my jewellery and money had been broken open and all thy Jowellery and money was taken; after I found what had happened I went for the police; when I found that my monoy and Jowellery were taken I called out and sald so, and some Chinamen then cane into the house, and smong them was Ah Fuey; I am cortain that he was there; I am certain that the aecused Lee Hoy was not in the house at all; Officer Dominy ceme back with me; there was no table in ray bodroom; I never said to anybody that it was a good job that the jevollery was not taken.
Question by Accused:
Did I not ask you whether you had lost the gold pieces shortly after you gave the alarm? Ans. No.

Did you not tell me that you were going to get the Polace? Ans. I did not.

Dad not I say to you that if you are going for the Police I wall so out? Ans, You did not. (Sd) Sing Lee.

There was no table in the bedroom; there was a counter, but there was no jewellery on $2 t$; there were no $\$ 5.00$ sold pieces on the countor or anywhere else vasable; Lee Hoy was not in the house at all; I could have seon ham if he had beenifhere; I know ho was not there; I know him well.
