We the Grand Jury
of the Supreme Court impaneled at
Port Douglas July 24th. 1860. beg most
respectfully to present for your Excellency's
consideration the following report—

1st

We take great pleasure in announcing
to your Excellency that no case was
presented for our consideration, and also
the able manner in which Judge Beggs
performed his duties. &c.

That we deem

it all important that the present Jail
be removed and a more suitable one
erected in its stead, so that the Prisoners
be kept here, and employed in grading
and clearing the Skute without being
sent to New Westminster, or elsewhere.

2nd

The congratulations of the Grand Jury
are tendered to your Excellency for the
expeditious manner in which our Wagon
Road is so near completion, through the
instrumentality of your Excellency.

3rd

The great necessity there exists for
a Church as the population is increasing
to the extent that we deem it most
essential to advocate its erection.
