District or County of *Yale*

BE IT remembered, That on the *Seventh* day of *March*, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and *eighty two* at *The town* of *Yale*, in the said District or County of *King "a Chinaman"*, is convicted before the undersigned *J. Murray* of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said District or County, for that the said *King "a Chinaman"* On the information of *Theodore K. Murray* of the town of *Yale* aforesaid for that the said *King*, did on the Twenty eighth day of February A.D. 1882 at *Terminal City* 15 miles above *Yale*, use, practise, and carry on the trade of vending spirituous liquors by retail, without having taken out a Licence, and had granted to him a licence in that behalf.

and I adjudge the said *King "a Chinaman"* for his said offence to forfeit and pay the sum of *Two Hundred dollars* together with *Thirty dollars for Licence*. The said sums to go to Her Majesty.

to be paid and applied according to law, and also to pay to the said *Theodore K. Murray* the sum of *Twenty two dollars & fifty cents*, for his costs in this behalf; and if the said several sums be not paid forthwith, or on or before the

next, I order that the same be levied of by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the said *King* and in default of sufficient distress, I adjudge the said

*King "a Chinaman"* to be imprisoned in the Common Gaol of the said District or County, at *Provincial Workhouse* in the said District or County of *Province* (there to be kept at hard labour if such be the sentence) for the space of *Three months* unless the said several sums and all costs and charges of the said distress (and of the commitment and conveying of the said *King* to the said Common Gaol, shall be sooner paid.

Warrant of Commitment for want of Distress

Canada.

Province of British Columbia }  
District of Yale }

To all or any of the Constables, or other  
Peace Officers, in the said District of Yale,  
Province of British Columbia, and to the Keeper  
of the Common Gaol of the said Province  
at New Westminster

Whereas. King "A. Chinaman"  
late of Lummi City, 15 miles above Yale in the  
District aforesaid was on the seventh day of  
March eighteen hundred and eighty two duly  
convicted before me one of Her Majesty's  
Justices of the Peace in and for the said  
Province on the information of Theodore R.  
Murray of the town of Yale aforesaid for that  
he the said King "A. Chinaman" did on the  
28th day of February A.D. 1882. at Lummi  
City, 15 miles above Yale aforesaid. do and  
practise, and carry on the trade of vending  
spirituous liquors by retail, without having  
taken out a Licence, and had granted to  
him a Licence in that behalf, and it was  
thereby adjudged that the said King should  
for such offence forfeit and pay the sum  
of Two Hundred dollars, together with Thirty  
dollars for Licence. the said sums to go to  
Her Majesty, and should also pay to the said  
Theodore R. Murray the sum of Twenty-two  
dollars & fifty cents for his costs in that behalf



and it was hereby ordered that if the said several sums should not be paid forthwith the same should be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the said King; and it was hereby also adjudged that the said King in default of sufficient distress should be imprisoned in the Common Gaol of the said Province at New Westminster in the said Province and there to be kept for the space of three months, unless the said several sums and all costs and charges of the said distress, and of the commitment and conveyance of the said King, to the said Common gaol should be recovered from him; And whereas afterwards on the Fourteenth day of March in the year aforesaid, I the said Justice, issued a Warrant to all or any of the Constables or other Peace Officers of the District of Yale commanding them or any of them, to levy the said sums of Two Hundred dollars together with Thirty dollars per Service, and Twenty-two dollars. <sup>5/-</sup> Costs by distress and sale of the goods & chattels of the said King; And whereas it appears to me as well by the return to the said warrant of distress, by the Constable who had the execution of the same as otherwise that the said Constable hath made diligent search for the goods and Chattels of the said King, but that no sufficient distress wherein to levy the sums above mentioned could be found; These are therefore to command you, the said Constables or Peace Officers or any one of you, to take the said King, and him safely



To convey to the Common Gaol at New  
Westminster aforesaid, and there to deliver  
him to the said Roper, together with this  
Precept; and I do hereby command you  
the said Roper of the said Common Gaol,  
to receive the said King, into your custody  
in the said Common Gaol, thence to  
imprison him for the space of three  
months, unless the said several sum,  
and all the costs and charges of the said  
distress (and of the commitment and  
conveying of the said King to the said  
Common Gaol) amounting to the further  
sum of Twenty five dollars  
shall be sooner paid unto you, the said  
Roper; and for so doing this shall be  
your sufficient Warrant.

I am informant in this case. I came to Yale on the 6<sup>th</sup> of last Jan<sup>r</sup>. I have been working on the Railway during that time. I was at the Big Horn on the 28<sup>th</sup> February last. I saw the Defendant King on that day. I bought some whiskey of him. bottle produced I recognize that bottle of liquor, it is spirituous liquor. I paid the Defendant \$1<sup>75</sup> for it. Had no trouble in getting it. Fairfax was with me when I bought. paid for and obtained the bottle. I brought the bottle placed it in Mr. Deodring's hands government Agent. Yale I drew the cork and tasted the whiskey. it was pretty good whiskey.

I packed this bottle produced with me to Barket.

I came to Yale in May last; I work on the Railroad. I was in company with D.M. Murray on February 28th last at the Big Tunnel.

I recognize the Prisoner King, he was at Big Tunnel City on the 28th February last. I saw Murray purchase a bottle of whiskey at King's - bottle produced - that is the bottle. I saw Murray pay \$1.75 to King for that bottle, he had no trouble in getting it.

I got spirituous liquor from King last summer, and paid him for one bottle \$1.50.

Timothy Sullivan being duly sworn deposed

I came to Yale 2 years ago next June  
I worked for Harper & C°. I worked for the  
the Railway C° since 14<sup>th</sup> last October.  
I know the Defendant Ring - on or about  
the 28<sup>th</sup> of February last I bought of Ring  
at his house a bottle of whisky for which  
I paid him \$1.75. I have bought spirits and  
liquor (liquors) from Ring and paid  
him some five or six times, he sold it  
to me without hesitation, the Defendant  
is a waiter at Underdonk's boarding house  
I generally received the liquor from Ring  
outside the dining room.

+ I did not see Murray or Fairweather  
buying liquor at Ring's. I never informed  
of the Chinaman.

I am expressman and plying between Yale & the Big Lumin. I recognize the Defendant King; I have packed spirituous liquors for him lately. Between the last two months I have taken him up five or six cases - spirituous liquor, from the H.B.C. Defendant paid me expressages.

King is in the employ of Underdout water works & sawing wood, when the Chinaman rec'd the liquor from me he generally put it into the Chinaman's sleeping room.
