do sincerely promise and swear that I will be faithful and bear true allegiance to His Majesty King Edward the Seventh, as lawful Sovereign of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the Dominion of Canada, dependent on and belonging to the said Kingdom, and that I will defend Him to the utmost of my power against all traitorous conspiracies or attempts whatever which shall be made against His person, Crown, and Dignity, and that I will do my utmost endeavour to disclose and make known to His Majesty, His Heirs or successors, all treasons or traitorous conspiracies, and attempts, which I shall know to be against Him or any of them; and all this I do swear without any equivocation, mental evasion or secret reservation. So help me God.
