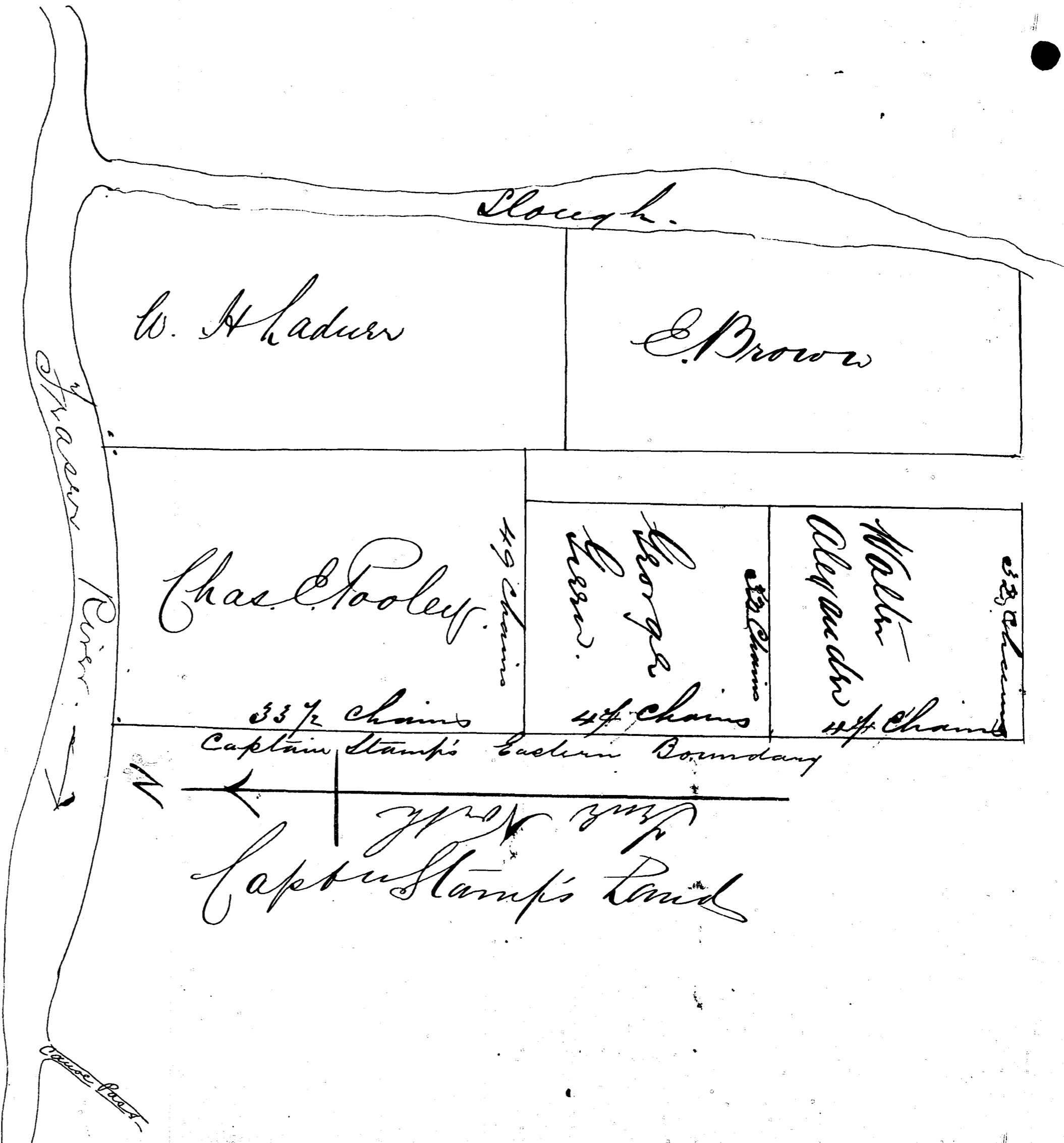
Having served five years
