CORONER'S PRECEPT.

} To the Constable of
Yale District

By virtue of my office, these are, in Her Majesty's name, to require and command you, immediately upon sight hereof, to summon and sworn twenty-four good and lawful men of
Yale District to be and appear before me, *Sibbs Clarke*, one of the Coroners of *said District*
at *Court Room, Lytton*, in the said *District*
on the *Eighteenth* day of *November*, at *half past twelve* of the clock
in the *fore* noon, then and there to enquire of, do, and execute all such things as on Her
Majesty's behalf shall be lawfully given them in charge, touching the death of

the Queen AND be you then and there to certify
what you shall have done in the premises: and further to do and execute what in behalf of our said Lady
the Queen shall be then and there enjoined you.

Inquest - Ah Chow - 9.30 A.M.

Casper Phair sworn saith I am Sheriff of and for the Clinton Judicial District. According to the Calendar of General Sessions held at Lyttown on the tenth of October 1887 Ah Chow was sentenced to be hanged by Mr Justice Walkin on the eighteenth of November 1887. I here produce said Calendar as evidence. On second November 1887 received thirtieth November 1887 the Under Secretary of State commanded me to execute Ah Chow, and I here produce his letter to that effect. The Deputy Attorney General at Victoria, also requested me to carry out the instructions of the Secretary of State in letter dated second November 1887. In accordance with these instructions I have caused the execution of the said Ah Chow at eight o'clock this morning.

Frederick Heassey, sworn saith
I am the jailor of Lytton jail
and knew the prisoner ~~W^t Chow~~ during his life time, I was present
at Lytton Assizes held at Lytton
July 2^d & 3^d inst last when said
~~W^t Chow~~ was convicted of
murder and sentenced to be
hung by the Honourable Justice
Walke. By Order of the Judge
prisoner was removed to Westminster
Prison for safe custody which was
done, and he was returned to me
on the night of the twelfth
instant, and has been in my
custody until now. I witnessed
the execution of said ~~W^t Chow~~ this
morning, and identify the body
now delivered to me as that of
the said ~~W^t Chow~~. The body
shown to the jury is that of the
said ~~W^t Chow~~.
