Frederick Seymour Esquire
Governor of British Columbia.
Sir,

At a public meeting held at
the Town Hall this evening I was
appointed Honorary Secretary of a
Committee, representing generally
the public of the City and District
of New Westminster, for the purpose
of making arrangements for the
celebration of Her Majesty's birthday
in a suitable manner.

to apply to the Government for the
appropriation of a portion of the sum
voted by the Legislative Council for
the entertainment of Indians.
