I am directed to enclose to you the first of the 2nd & 3rd files of Exchange for £10 given to this Society by the two females whose signatures are therein in consideration of that amount having been advanced by the Society to enable them to sail by the "Clayton" to Victoria, which they did on the 5th inst. - Mr. A. Godwin in making the application to the Society, asked for their assistance as also in stating that his brother would willingly repay the same.

As you were formerly on the Council of this Society the Committee thought you would kindly place the matter in the hands of some of the officers of your Government for collection and submitting to this Society.

Trust that this Society may ere long be honoured with some communication from your Government upon the subject of assisted Emigration to Vancouver Island.
